Feeling aggrieved against the alleged inaction on the part of respondent authorities, petitioners have approached this Court by way of instant writ petition under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India, seeking a writ in the nature of mandamus.

Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that when the grievance of the petitioners was not being redressed, they finally approached the respondent authorities, by way of representation dated 10.9.2014 (Annexure P-5) as well as identical representations made on behalf of other petitioners, but the same are also pending decision. He further submits that the petitioners will be satisfied in case respondent No.1 is directed to consider and decide the representation(s) of the petitioners, within a reasonable time.

Having heard the learned counsel for the petitioners and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, lest it should prejudice the rights of either of the parties, Registrar General, Punjab and Haryana High Court, Chandigarh-respondent No.1, is directed to look into

the matter, consider the grievance of the petitioners raised vide representation dated 10.9.2014 (Annexure P-5) as well as identical representations made on behalf of other petitioners and decide the same keeping in view the order dated 9.1.2015 passed by this Court in CWP No. 14802 of 2014 (Rajesh Kumar Khatana and another v. Registrar (General), Punjab and Haryana High Court, Chandigarh and others, at an early date, by passing an appropriate order thereon, strictly in accordance with law, but in any case within a period of three months from the date of receipt of a certified copy of this order.

With the above-said observations made and directions issued, present writ petition stands disposed of.
