RAMESHWAR SINGH MALIK, J. (Oral)

Feeling aggrieved against the alleged inaction on the part of respondent authorities, petitioner has approached this Court by way of instant writ petition under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India, seeking a writ in the nature of mandamus.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that pursuant to communication dated 21.10.2013 (Annexure P-3), petitioner was not paid anything by respondents No. 1 and 2.

On the other hand, learned counsel for respondents No.1 and 2 submits that pursuant to communication (Annexure P-3), petitioner never turned up and informed the competent authority as to what amount of the petitioner was pending against respondents No. 1 and 2 and for which period.

In view of the above-said respective stands taken by both the learned counsel for the parties, the present writ petition is disposed of, with

liberty to the petitioner to approach respondents No. 1 and 2 satisfying his claim, on account of any of his service benefits for which respondents No. 1 and 2 might be under legal obligation to pay to the petitioner.

Let him do so within a period of one month from today.

It is further directed if the petitioner approaches respondent No.2 within a period of one month from today by moving an appropriate representation, the same shall be considered and decided at an early date by passing an appropriate order thereon, strictly in accordance with law, but in any case within a period of three months from the date of receipt of representation from the petitioner.

With the above-said observations made and directions issued, the present writ petition stands disposed of.
