DEEPAK SIBAL, J. (Oral)

Learned counsel for the petitioner prays for the issuance of a direction to the respondents for the release of subsistence allowance during the period when the petitioner was under suspension and for quashing of the charge-sheet dated 21.01.2015 (Annexure P-3).

So far as the prayer for release of subsistence allowance is concerned, the record reveals that the petitioner has already made a representation dated 12.03.2015 (Annexure P-10) to respondent No.3, which according to the counsel for the petitioner remain undecided.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that at this stage, he would be satisfied if a direction is issued to respondent No.3 to take a decision on the representation dated 12.03.2015 (Annexure P-10), submitted by the petitioner.

I find the prayer made by learned counsel for the petitioner to be reasonable.

Accordingly, without commenting on the merits of the case, respondent No.3 is directed to take a decision on the representation dated 12.03.2015 (Annexure P-10), submitted by the petitioner, by passing a speaking order and after affording opportunity of hearing to the petitioner, preferably within four months from the date of receipt of a certified copy of this order.

So far as the prayer for quashing of the charge-sheet dated 21.01.2015 (Annexure P-3) is concerned, according to me, at this stage, the prayer is premature. However, in view of the facts and circumstances of the case, the official respondents are directed to complete the disciplinary proceedings initiated against the petitioner within six months from the date of receipt of a certified copy of this order.

The writ petition stands disposed of in the above terms.
