By way of the instant writ petition, under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India, the petitioner seeks issuance of directions to the respondents to release the retiral benefits including gratuity, commuted pension, revised pension arrears, arrears of ACP, arrears on account of pay scale w.e.f. 01.01.2006 under the 5th Punjab Pay Commission, medical reimbursement expenses along with admissible interest thereon with regard to the service rendered by the petitioner with the respondent-Corporation.

At the very outset, the learned counsel for the petitioner states that the case of the petitioner is squarely covered by judgment of this in case **Ashok Kumar Vs. Pepsu Road Transport Corporation and others**, rendered in CWP No. 6971 of 2013,

decided on 08.04.2015. The petitioner is similarly situated to the petitioner as in CWP No. 6971 of 2013.

The learned counsel for the respondent does not dispute the factual aspect of the matter.

Accordingly, the present petition is allowed. The respondent-Corporation is directed to release the entire retiral dues to the petitioner within a period of four months from the date of receipt of a certified copy of this order.

However, it is made clear that in case, the payment is not made within the stipulated period, the present petition shall be deemed to have been revived, without notice.
