**TEJINDER SINGH DHINDSA, J.**

The instant writ petition has been filed claiming relief under the Rehabilitation and Resettlement Scheme formulated for the dam oustees pertaining to Ranjit Sagar Dam.

The present petitioner namely Dimple Kumar claimed to be the grand son of Rattno Devi. As per the eligibility conditions contained in the Rehabilitation Scheme, employment opportunities are to be offered to one member per family subject to the following:

*“I) Those whose houses and land above 50% of holding has been acquired.*

*II) Landless oustees whose houses have been acquired.*

*III) Those residential families whose only land 75% or above has been acquired.”*

The instant writ petition is completely bereft of the necessary material as also averments, which would in turn demonstrate eligibility of the petitioner to claim benefit under the Rehabilitation and Resettlement Scheme.

At this stage, counsel for the petitioner prays for withdrawal of

the writ petition with liberty to file a petition afresh with better and necessary particulars so as to demonstrate eligibility of the petitioner to claim benefit under the Rehabilitation and Resettlement Scheme.

Prayer is allowed. The writ petition is dismissed as withdrawn with liberty as prayed for.
