Instant writ petition has been filed under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India for issuance of a writ in the nature of mandamus directing respondents no. 1 and 2 to withdraw the Arjuna Award and Bhim Award granted to respondent no.6 on the basis of sports achievements and also sought an inquiry by the CBI and case be registered.

The petitioner has approached this Court straightway. Disputed facts with regard to the age and other factors are required to be investigated and inquired into by the concerned authorities.

At this stage, learned counsel for the petitioner submits that petitioner has already sent a legal notice dated 19.10.2015 (Annexure P/7) to the various authorities i.e. respondents no. 1 to 5 and the same is pending.

Having heard learned counsel for the petitioner and after perusing the paper-book, however, without commenting on merits of the case, instant petition is disposed of, without issuing notice to the respondents, with a direction to the respondents-authorities to look into the grievance of the petitioner specifically made in legal notice dated 19.10.2015 (Annexure P/7) and take a decision in accordance with law and copy of the order so passed shall be communicated to the petitioner.
