Instant writ petition has been filed under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India for issuance of a writ in the nature of mandamus directing respondent no.4 to get the revenue record updated by recording the name of the petitioner in the ownership column.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner and perused the record.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that transfer deed between the parties has been executed, but in spite of fact that transfer deed being a registered document, the same is not being incorporated in the revenue record. Learned counsel for the petitioner further submits that as per the provisions of Land Record Manual, a registered document is required to be taken into consideration and entered in the revenue record. Learned counsel further submits that the petitioner has already moved

representations to the various authorities including Revenue Patwari, Tehsildar and Deputy Commissioner, but still no action has been taken. Learned counsel further submits that latest representation (Annexure P/5) is dated 10.11.2014, however, no date is mentioned in Annexure P/5.

Be that as it may, if such representation (Annexure P/5) has been filed, the same shall be decided by the Deputy Commissioner, Moga, in accordance with law within a period of two months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order. The petitioner will be at liberty to make a comprehensive representation after annexing relevant documents to the Deputy Commissioner, Moga and other authorities.

Instant writ petition is disposed of accordingly.
