Instant writ petition has been filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India for issuance of a writ in the nature of mandamus directing the respondents to pay the higher grade of Rs.110-250 as revised from time to time to the JST Teachers in accordance with the qualifications possessed/acquired by the petitioner and instructions issued from time to time.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner has already moved a legal notice dated 12.02.2014 (Annexure P/8), but no action has been taken thereon. Learned counsel confines his prayer for a direction to the respondents to decide his legal notice in view of judgment of this Court passed in CWP No. 3931 of 1992 – Baldev Raj Mittal and

others vs. State of Punjab and others, decided on 15.04.2009 (Annexure P/7).

Having heard learned counsel for the petitioner and after perusing the paper-book, however, without commenting on merits of the case and without giving notice to the respondents, instant writ petition is disposed of with a direction to the respondents, to look into the grievance of the petitioner specifically made in the legal notice (Annexure P/8) and pass a speaking order in the light of judgment (Annexure P/7). Needful shall be done within a period of three months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order and copy of the order so passed shall be communicated to the petitioner forthwith.
