On 12.2.2015, this Court directed the State to constitute a committee of experts to go into the question as to whether the qualification possessed by the petitioner would meet the requirement of essential qualification as prescribed under the advertisement/rule.

Mr.Keshav Gupta, learned Assistant Advocate General, Haryana appearing on behalf of the State has handed over copy of the report dated 7.5.2005 and as per the said report, the syllabus of Microbiology and Microbiology & Herbal Medicine are same, rather Microbiology & Herbal Medicine are more exhaustive and, hence, Microbiology & Herbal Medicine can be easily equated at par with Microbiology. The petitioner is stated to have a degree of M.Sc. Microbiology & Herbal Medicine and as per the said report, the candidate having the aforesaid qualification is allowed to

complete for the post of PGT Biology.

Learned State counsel has also handed over copy of the result of the petitioner and on my directions, it has been opened and as per the result sheet, the petitioner has obtained grand total of 63.64. The petitioner is, thus, eligible for being selected for the post of PGT Biology. He further states that the cut of marks is 57.83 and, therefore, the petitioner obtained much more than the cut of marks. Accordingly, a direction is issued to the respondents to issue appointment letter to the petitioner for the post of PGT Biology and all the consequential benefits shall be given to the petitioner from the date her juniors have been given appointment.

This Court, vide order dated 14.3.2013 observed that the appointment, if any, made to the post of P.G.T. (Biology) shall remain subject to outcome of the writ petition.

In view of the said observation, the petitioner shall be entitled to all the consequential benefits. It is expected that the respondent authority shall issue the appointment letter and all consequential benefits to the petitioner forthwith, preferably within a period of one week from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order.

Registry is directed to tag the photocopies of the report, result and the cut of marks at the end of the paper book. The original result is returned to the learned State Counsel.

Accordingly, the writ petition is allowed.
