This Civil Writ Petition has been filed, under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India, for issuance of directions to the respondents to count the daily wages service followed by regularisation for the purposes of pensionary benefits and release the same along with all consequential benefits and interest @18% p.a.

Learned counsel for the respondents submits that entire retiral benefits have been paid.

On the above statement, the learned counsel for the petitioners states that though, the entire payment has been released, but the same has been released belatedly. Thus, the learned counsel states that no interest has been paid on the delayed payment.

As the payment has been made, the petitioners are free to

make representation to the authority with regard to the interest on delayed payment.

In case such an representation is filed within 45 days from the receipt of certified copy of this order, the authority shall decide the case of the petitioners in terms of statutory instructions.

Accordingly, the present writ petition is disposed of with a direction to respondents to consider the representation of the petitioners, in terms of statutory instructions, expeditiously, preferably within a period of four months from the date of receipt of such representation.
