Instant writ petition has been filed under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India for issuance of a writ in the nature of mandamus directing the official respondents no. 1 to 8 to conduct a detailed enquiry into the alleged irregularities committed by respondent no.9.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that some irregularities have been committed by respondent no.9. The petitioner has already moved representations to the various authorities including respondent no.2 i.e. Director, Rural Development and Panchayat, Punjab. Lastly, he moved representation dated 10.08.2014 (Annexure P/10) to the Director, Rural Development and Panchayat, Punjab, but no action has been taken thereon. Learned counsel further submits that direction may be

issued to respondent no.2 - Director, Rural Development and Panchayat, Punjab to take appropriate decision on the representation (Annexure P/10) within a stipulated period.

Having heard learned counsel for the petitioner and after perusing the paper-book, however, without commenting on merits of the case, instant petition is disposed of with a direction to respondent no.2 – Director, Rural Development and Panchayat, Punjab to pass an appropriate order on the representation (Annexure P/10) in accordance with law, within a period of three months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order.
