**CWP No. 4058 of 2015**

Counsel for the respondents, in compliance with the order  
passed by this Court dated 20.03.2015, submits that the Civil  
Surgeon, Karnal, had referred the victim to the Post Graduate

Institute of Medical Education and Research, Chandigarh, where a Medical Board was constituted by the Medical Superintendent, PGI, Chandigarh vide order dated 24.03.2015 and the meeting of the Board was held on 26.03.2015 at 3 P.M. The Board consisted of the Chairperson, Medical Board and Professor, Department of Obst. & Gynecology, Additional Professor, Department of Pediatric Medicine, Additional Professor, Department of Forensic Medicine, Department of Obst. & Gynecology, Assistant Professor, Department of Radiodiagnosis and Imaging and Chief Medical Officer.

As per the opinion given by the Board, there is no imminent danger to the life of the victim if the pregnancy is continued. However, it has been observed that a teenage pregnancy is a high risk pregnancy and needs regular close supervision and institutional delivery and the details have also been explained to the petitioner, who is the mother of the victim.

In the light of the opinion of the Medical Board, which consisted of eminent doctors belonging to different fields, no further action can be taken by this Court with regard to the prayer made by the petitioner.

The writ petition is disposed of with liberty to the petitioner to approach the Chief Medical Officer, Karnal, who is directed to provide all medical help to the victim as and when required.
