It is the contention of the counsel for the petitioner that various buses were requisitioned by respondents No. 2 and 3 for transportation of police officials, the details of which have been mentioned in the representations dated 22.04.2014 (Annexures P-5/T and P-6/T) but till date, the amount due to the petitioner has not been released. He states that the petitioner, at this stage, would be satisfied if a direction is issued to The Deputy Commissioner, Bathinda-respondent No. 2 to consider and decide the claim of the petitioner dated 22.04.2014 (Annexures P-5/T and P-6/T) in consultation with The Senior Superintendent of Police, Bathinda-respondent No. 3 within some specified time and grant the consequential benefits.

In the light of the statement made by the counsel for the petitioner and without going into the merits of the case or commenting thereon, the present petition is disposed of with a direction to The Deputy Commissioner, Bathinda-respondent No. 2 to consider and decide the claim of the petitioner dated 22.04.2014 (Annexures P-5/T and P-6/T) in consultation with The Senior Superintendent of Police, Bathinda-respondent No. 3 within a period of four weeks' from the date of receipt of certified copy of the order. Decision so taken be conveyed to the petitioner forthwith.

In case the claim of the petitioner is accepted, the consequential benefits, if any, be released to it, in accordance with law, within a further period of four weeks.
