Learned senior counsel for the petitioner contends that without giving any notice to the petitioner, recovery amounting to ₹ 1,48,11,270/- has been ordered and a notice for the same has been served on the petitioner. The petitioner has the liberty to approach the competent authority for projecting its response to the same.

Learned senior counsel for the petitioner states that the Chief Commercial Manager, vide communication dated 30.06.2010, has agreed with the Committee's view to refer the matter to the Divisional Railway Manager but thereafter, no steps have been taken.

If that be so, the petitioner may project this position also and the competent authority would take the same also into consideration while deciding the objections/representation submitted by the petitioner.

The writ petition is disposed of with above observations.
