Through the present writ petition petitioner seeks the quashing of the order dated 29.12.2014 (Annexure P-19) passed by respondent No.1, whereby the recognition granted to the petitioner-institute for the Diploma Undergraduate and Postgraduate Courses has been revoked.

The challenge has also been made to the order passed in appeal which was passed on 10.03.2015 (Annexure P-23) and the appeal has been rejected. The petitioner-institute thereafter has been asked to shift the students to other institutions affiliated to the Pandit B.D. Sharma University of Health Sciences for the session 2014-15.

In the written statement filed by respondent No.1, the writ petition has been opposed on the ground that there was an undated complaint forwarded by the CBI New Delhi regarding corruption in approval process and undue favours to the petitioner college. It is, however, submitted that in the next session i.e. 2015-16, the college which has many deficiencies has removed the same.

Keeping in view the stand taken, this Court is of the opinion that a fresh decision should be taken upon the issue by respondent No.1. It is always open to the said respondent to re-inspect the premises of the petitioner and give it a show cause notice regarding the deficiencies, if any, and pass a fresh order. The infrastructure which is available on record would be kept in mind unfettered by the earlier order passed. In case, there is no deficiency, it is expected that respondent No.1 would pass appropriate orders.

With the above said observations, the present writ petition is disposed of.
