Prayer in the present petition filed under Articles 226 and 227 of the Constitution of India is for issuance of directions to the respondents to count the service rendered by the petitioner from 16.09.1985 to 14.07.1997 with the Punjab Land Development and Reclamation Corporation towards pensionary service in the Government Department, to release pensionary benefits and all consequential benefits along with interest.

Reply on behalf of respondent No.5 filed in the Court, is taken on record.

Learned State counsel informs that respondent No.3-The Chief Agriculture Officer, Rupnagar has approved the case of the

petitioner for counting the service rendered with respondent No.5. The necessary communication, for release of all admissible benefits in favour of the petitioner, shall be sent shortly to the respondent No.4-Accountant General, Punjab.

In view of the statement made, learned counsel for the petitioner wishes to withdraw the present petition.

However, it is made clear that the respondent No.3 shall ensure that the necessary record is sent to respondent No.4 without further delay, preferably within two weeks from today.

Thereafter, the respondent No.4 shall release all the admissible benefits in terms of the proposal, sent by the respondent No.3, within six weeks from receipt of such proposal.

Dismissed as withdrawn with aforesaid terms.
