AUGUSTINE GEORGE MASIH, J. (Oral):

Counsel for the petitioners contends that respondents No.2 to 9 are not complying with the directions issued by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in Writ Petition (Civil) No.136 of 2003, titled as 'Paramjit Bhasin & others Vs. Union of India' wherein while dealing with various provisions of the Motor Vehicles Act, specific directions have been issued with regard to overloading of the vehicles which are in violation of the provisions of the Motor Vehicles Act. He contends that the petitioners had been bringing in the notice of the respondents the violations which are being committed by respondents No.3 to 7, 10 and 11 with no action having been taken by respondents No.8 and 9. Petitioners have submitted a detailed complaint dated 29.04.2014 (Annexure P-6) to the Regional Transport Officer, Ferozepur-respondent No.8 but no action thereon has been taken.

Counsel contends that the petitioners, at this stage, would be satisfied if a direction is issued to the respondents to comply with the

provisions the Motor Vehicles Act as per the mandate given by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in the judgment of *Paramjit Bhasin's* case (supra) and to convey the action taken on the complaint dated 29.04.2014 (Annexure P-6) within some specified time.

In the light of the statement made by the counsel for the petitioners, the present writ petition is disposed of with directions to the Regional Transport Officer, Administrative Complex, Ferozepur Cantt, Ferozepur and District Transport Officer, Administrative Complex, Ferozepur Cantt, Ferozepur, respondents No.8 and 9 respectively, to look into the complaint submitted by the petitioners within a period of three weeks from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order and take appropriate steps in accordance with law.

Decision so taken on the complaint be conveyed to the petitioners forthwith and compliance report submitted to this Court a period of six weeks.
