MAHESH GROVER, J.

The petitioner had questioned the decision (Annexure P-1) which debarred him from taking examination of SAS (Annexure P-2) on the ground that departmental inquiry was pending against him.

Learned counsel for the petitioner had contended that there was no such stipulation to debar him from such an examination and his service record for last 10 years is 'Good' or 'Very Good'. He has stated that he has also passed SAS Part I examination.

While putting the State on notice, the petitioner had been permitted to take SAS Part II examination provisionally.

The respondents have now placed on record a communication indicating that departmental proceedings have been dropped.

If that be so then there would be no impediment in the way of the

petitioner's consideration for the SAS Part II which the exam for which in any case he had taken pursuant to the orders of this Court. Consequently, instant petition is disposed of with a direction to the respondents to declare the result of the petitioner and in case he has qualified he should be given the necessary beneficial consequences thereof.
