Feeling aggrieved against the alleged inaction on the part of the respondent authority, the petitioner has approached this Court by way of instant writ petition under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India seeking a writ in the nature of Certiorari.

Learned counsel for the petitioner, at the very outset, fairly states that petitioner will be satisfied in case Secretary, Regional Transport Authority, Patiala – respondent no.2 is directed to consider and decide the representation of the petitioner which was received in the office of respondent no.2 on 30.05.2013 and still pending decision.

Faced with the above, learned counsel for the State also fairly states that he has got no objection to the proposal put by the learned counsel for the petitioner.

In view of the above respective stands taken by the learned counsel for the parties, Secretary, Regional Transport Authority, Patiala – respondent no.2 is directed to look into the matter, consider the grievance raised by the petitioner in his representation dated 30.05.2013 Annexure P6

and decide the same at an early date by passing an appropriate order, thereon, strictly in accordance with law but in any case within a period of two months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order.

With the above said observations made and directions issued, the instant writ petition stands disposed of.
