Reply filed on behalf of respondents no.2 and 3 in the court today is taken on record and copy thereof has been supplied to learned counsel for the petitioner.

Learned counsel for the State, while referring to averments taken in para 3 of the reply filed today in the court submits that since the impugned letter dated 28.3.2014 (Annexure P-6) has been withdrawn, vide letter dated 14.1.2015 (Annexure R-3/3), no cause of action survives in the present writ petition and the same may be disposed of, as having been rendered infructuous.

Faced with the above, learned counsel for the petitioner also fairly states that let the present writ petition be disposed of in view of the statement

made by learned counsel for the State.

In view of the abovesaid respective stands taken by learned counsel for the parties, present writ petition is ordered to be disposed of, as having been rendered infructuous. However, it is made clear that parties shall be at liberty to pursue their remedies, in accordance with law.
