The relief sought for in the writ petition cannot be granted, for, it is governed through previous directions of this court rendered in CWP No.2886 of 2010. The Court has observed that the keys would be handed over to the Commissioner of Police and the Commissioner of Police would be at liberty to hand over of the keys of the upper portion of the house to a person who is held to be in possession of that portion as per the decision of the civil court pending between parties. The lower portion was said to be in possession of the person, who has been convicted for an offence

under Section 302 IPC. The petitioner may approach the civil court where the case is pending for appropriate direction and not vex this court with the writ petition, the way it is being done. The writ petition stands disposed of.
