Challenge in the present writ petition is to an order of cancellation of license granted to the petitioner for running a chemist shop in the Post Graduate Institute of Medical Education and Research (PGIMER) on the ground that the petitioner has defaulted in making payment of monthly license fee, service tax and electricity charges. After the orders was passed, the petitioner has deposited substantial amount to liquidate the arrears. Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that he has paid the entire arrears of the license fee, service tax and the electricity charges.

On the other hand, Mr. Jhanji, learned counsel for respondent points out that not only the petitioner was not regular in making payment of license fee, service tax and the electricity charges due but there was other complaints in running of the chemist shop as well.

In view of the assertion of the respondent, we deem it appropriate to grant liberty to the respondents to issue a fresh show cause notice as to why the license be not terminated by tomorrow itself i.e. 7.5.2015, pointing out the deficiency in running of the chemist shop by the petitioner. The petitioner will submit its reply within two days i.e. on or before 9.5.2015. The respondent will be at liberty to take a decision according to law as expeditiously as possible thereafter.

In the meanwhile, the bids received by the respondent inviting tenders for grant of license of the chemist shop shall be kept in a sealed cover.

Disposed of in the above terms.
