RAMESHWAR SINGH MALIK, J. (Oral)

Feeling aggrieved against the alleged inaction on the part of respondent authorities, petitioner has approached this Court by way of instant writ petition under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India, seeking a writ in the nature of mandamus.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that when the grievance of the petitioner was not being redressed, he finally approached the respondent authorities, by way of legal notice dated 24.9.2014 (Annexure P-6), but the same is also pending decision. He further submits that the petitioner will be satisfied in case respondent No.4 is directed to consider and decide his legal notice, within a reasonable time.

Having heard the learned counsel for the petitioner and without expressing any opinion on the merits of case, including the issue of limitation, if any, lest it should prejudice the rights of either of the parties, Tehsildar-cum-Assistant Collector Second Grade, Malerkotla, District Sangrur-respondent No.4, is directed to look into the matter, consider the

grievance of the petitioner raised vide his legal notice dated 24.9.2014 (Annexure P-6) and decide the same at an early date, by passing an appropriate order thereon, strictly in accordance with law, but in any case within a period of two months from the date of receipt of a certified copy of this order.

With the above-said observations made and directions issued, the present writ petition stands disposed of.
