1. Whether reporters of local papers may be allowed to see the judgment ?

A short reply on behalf of respondent No.5 has been filed in Court. The same is taken on record.

This Court vide order dated 6.5.2015 after noticing the contention of the petitioner issued notice of motion. The order reads thus:-

“Learned counsel for the petitioner confines his prayer only to violation of Rule 16.38 of Punjab Police Rules, applicable to Haryana and submits that the authorities have not taken concurrence of the District Magistrate before proceeding departmentally against the petitioner.

Notice of motion.

At the asking of the Court Mr. Hitesh Pandit Additional Advocate Additional Advocate General, Haryana accepts notice on behalf of the respondents. Learned counsel for the petitioner shall supply six copies of the paper book to the State counsel during the course of the day.

To come up on 13.5.2015.

To be shown in the urgent list.”

In response to the notice, Mr. Hitesh Pandit has filed short reply on behalf of respondent No.5 to contend that compliance of rule 16.38 of Punjab Police Rules applicable to Haryana has been made. The attested vernacular copy of the same has been handed over to this Court which is taken on record.

Registry is directed to tag the same at an appropriate place.

In view of the fact that concurrence of the District Magistrate had been obtained, the compliance of the rules has been made. Thus no cause of action survives in the present case.

Accordingly, the writ petition is dismissed.

The petitioner shall be at liberty to take all the defences before the enquiry officer.
