Instant writ petition has been filed under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India for issuance of a writ in the nature of mandamus directing the respondents to grant and release the retiral benefits i.e. gratuity, leave encashment and others arrears of increments to the petitioner.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner has already moved a legal notice dated 21.12.2014 (Annexure P/5), but no action has been taken thereon.

Having heard learned counsel for the petitioner and after perusing the paper-book, however, without commenting on merits of the case and without giving notice to the respondents, instant writ petition is

disposed of with a direction to the respondents, to look into the grievance of the petitioner specifically made in the legal notice (Annexure P/5) and pass an appropriate order in accordance with law. Needful shall be done within a period of two months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order and copy of the order so passed shall be communicated to the petitioner forthwith.
