**AUGUSTINE GEORGE MASIH, J. (ORAL)**

Petitioner, who claims itself to be a registered Society fighting corruption, has approached this Court alleging that respondent No.8 has wrongly availed of her appointment to the post of Staff Nurse and claimed the benefits while working in the Government Hospital as also a private college. Counsel for the petitioner contends that the documents, which the petitioner has received under the Right to Information, clearly indicate that she had been working at two places at the same time and availing the salary from both the places. Counsel accordingly contends that action should be initiated against respondent No.8 and an impartial departmental inquiry be conducted and disciplinary action mandated under the Punjab Civil Services Rules initiated against her.

Perusal of the record indicates that a regular departmental inquiry was held against respondent No.8 in which the allegations made against her have not been proved. On the basis of the said inquiry report, the competent authority i.e. the Managing Director, National Health

Commission has consigned the complaint accepting the inquiry report.

The said order is dated 03.09.2014. Copy of the inquiry report and the order passed by the competent authority are placed on record as Annexure P-9.

In view of the above, I do not find any merit in the present writ petition since the competent authority has already looked into the complaint made against respondent No.8 and passed appropriate orders in accordance with law.

The writ petition, therefore, stands dismissed.
