RAMESHWAR SINGH MALIK, J. (Oral)

Feeling aggrieved against the alleged inaction on the part of respondent authorities, petitioner has approached this Court by way of instant writ petition under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India, seeking a writ in the nature of mandamus.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that against the punishment order dated 16.6.2014, petitioner filed a statutory appeal (Annexure P-6) before respondent No.2. He further submits that the said statutory appeal is pending consideration before respondent No.2 from about six months. He further submits that the petitioner will be satisfied in case respondent No.2 is directed to consider and decide his statutory appeal, within a reasonable time.

Having heard the learned counsel for the petitioner and without expressing any opinion on the merits of case, lest it should prejudice the rights of either of the parties, the Secretary to H.E. the Governor Haryana-cum-Appellate Authority, Haryana State Council for Child Welfare, Chandigarh-respondent No.2, is directed to look into the matter,

consider the grievance of the petitioner raised vide his statutory appeal dated 21.7.2014 (Annexure P-6) and decide the same at an early date, by passing an appropriate order thereon, strictly in accordance with law, but in any case within a period of three months from the date of receipt of a certified copy of this order.

With the above-said observations made and directions issued, the present writ petition stands disposed of.
