RAJIVE BHALLA, J (ORAL)

The appellant challenges, order dated 18.12.2014, passed by the Guardian Judge, Karnal, whereby his petition, filed under Section 25 of the Guardian and Wards Act, 1890, seeking custody of the minor child of the parties has been dismissed.

Counsel for the appellant states on instructions from the appellant-Ashok Kumar son of Late Sh.Ram Avtar Sharma, who is present in Court, that he would be satisfied if he is given visitation rights.

Counsel for the respondent states on instructions from the respondent-Anupama Sharma, that she has no objection if the appellant is granted visitation rights.

We have heard counsel for the parties and while affirming the impugned order as regards guardianship and custody of the minor and dismissing the appeal, modify order

dated 18.12.2014 in the following terms:-

The minor Advitiya shall be produced by the respondent, on the first Saturday of every month in the office of the Secretary, Legal Services Authority, Karnal, at 3.00 PM for interaction with the appellant. The meeting shall last for one hour in the direct supervision of the Secretary, Legal Services Authority. The appellant shall pay Rs.2,000/- to the minor on each visit. The Secretary, Legal Services Authority, shall ensure that no harm comes to the minor and submit a report to this Court regarding each visit.

Disposed of accordingly.
