RAJIVE BHALLA, J.(Oral)

Ms. Suman, the appellant, is present in Court alongwith her father, her mother and her counsel and states that if the respondent is ready to resume matrimony and take up an independent accommodation, she has no objection to resumption of matrimony, shall withdraw her appeal and all other cases that she has filed against the respondent. Ms. Suman also states that in case the FIR is required to be quashed, she shall co-operate with the respondent in the quashing of the FIR, but it may be ensured that the respondent treats her with dignity and respect.

Pardeep Kumar-the respondent, is also present in Court and has filed an affidavit, dated 23.12.2015. A relevant

extract from the affidavit reads as under: -

1. *“That I will resume the matrimony and will keep my wife Suman-petitioner in a separate accommodation separately from my parents and other family members.*
2. *That I will keep my wife Suman with a due respect and care.*
3. *That I will perform all my responsibilities and obligations towards my wife namely Suman.”*

Ms. Suman states that in view of contents of the affidavit she is ready to resume matrimony and the appeal may be dismissed as withdrawn.

We have heard counsel for the parties, interacted with them and in view of statement made by the appellant and affidavit filed by the respondent, dismiss the appeal as withdrawn. The respondent shall take the appellant to the matrimonial home i.e. an independent accommodation to be rented out by the respondent, within three months.

In case of any difficulty, parties would be at liberty to approach this Court by way of an appropriate application.
