1. The appeal is at the instance of the insurance company on the issue of quantum. The claimants were the parents of the deceased, who was 21 years of age. The deceased was said to have obtained a diploma in Industrial Training Institute in the trade of Carpenter and had also completed the course of AUTO CAD under Skill Development Training Programme through Science and Technology of the Department of Science and Technology, Government of India. There were testimonials issued by the State Electronics Development Corporation Limited and the Industrial Training Institute for the educational attainments of the deceased. The Tribunal took the income for a carpenter at Rs. 9,680/- provided for prospective increase and assessed compensation by applying the formula

provided under Sarla Verma Versus Delhi Transport Corporation 2009 (3) RCR (Civil) 77 and later decision decision in Rajesh and others Versus Rajbir Singh and others 2013 (3) RCR (Civil) 170, for the choice of multiplier. The Tribunal provided also for loss of love and affection to the mother at Rs. 1,00,000/- and for loss to estate at Rs. 1,00,000/-.

2. I find the assessment to be in conformity with the liberal scales provided by the Supreme Court recently. There is no error for re-appraisal brought at the instance of the insurer.

3. The award is confirmed. The appeal is dismissed.
