This order will dispose of RFA Nos. 5781 to 5783 of 2015, as the same arise out of common acquisition.

The landowners are in appeal before this court seeking enhancement of compensation for the acquired land.

Briefly, the facts are that vide Notification dated 4.12.2000, issued under Section 4 of the Land Acquisition Act, 1894 (for short, 'the Act'), the land situated in the area of Village Shahpur, Hadbast No. 125, Tehsil and District Ambala, was sought to be acquired by the State of Haryana for development and utilisation thereof as residential, commercial and industrial area for Sectors 10, 11 and 12, Ambala Cantt. Notification under Section 6 of the Act was issued on 3.12.2001. The award was announced by the Land Acquisition Collector (for short, 'the Collector') on 11.9.2003, granting compensation @ ₹ 7,00,000/- per acre for the acquired land upto the depth of one acre from GT Road, ₹ 5,00,000/- per acre for land upto the depth of two acres from GT Road, ₹ 2,75,000/- per acre for chahi, ₹ 2,00,000/- per acre for barani and ₹ 1,50,000/- per acre for gair mumkin/ banjar kinds of land. Dissatisfied with the award of the Collector, the landowners filed objections. On reference, the learned court below vide award dated 24.1.2011 assessed the compensation for the acquired land @ ₹ 327/- per square yard up to the depth of one acre from GT Road and ₹ 297/- per square yard for the remaining land. Aggrieved against the award of the learned Court below, the landowners are in appeal before this Court.

Learned counsel for the appellants very fairly submitted that the claim of the landowners in the present appeals is squarely covered by judgment of this Court in RFA No. 2718 of 2011 Dilbagh Singh and others vs State of Haryana decided on 3.9.2015, whereby the award of the learned court below was upheld.

Since the award of the learned court below was upheld by this Court, no case for enhancement is made out. Accordingly, for the reasons mentioned in Dilbagh Singh's case (supra), the present appeals are dismissed. Consequently, the accompanying applications are also dismissed.
