The plaintiff filed suit seeking relief of mandatory injunction directing the defendant to allow him the benefit of provident fund from the year 1964. He alleged to have joined the service of respondent no.1 in the year 1964, however, on record he failed to prove this averment. The court of Civil Judge (Jr. Division), Batala partly decreed the suit of plaintiff directing the defendant to release the amount of Employees Provident Fund contribution in respect of salary of plaintiff which was lying deposited with respondent no.2- Regional Provident Fund Commissioner, Amritsar on completion of the required formalities. Judgment of Civil Judge (Jr. Division), Batala was upheld in appeal by the learned Additional District Judge (Adhoc) Fast Track Court, Batala and the appeal filed by the plaintiff-appellant was dismissed.

After arguing at length, learned counsel for appellant has not been able to make out any case that the plaintiff is entitled for employees Provident Fund since 1964 as claimed by him.

On perusal of the paper book and the judgments of the courts below, I find no legal or factual infirmity therein so as to interfere with the same.

No substantial question of law requiring determination arises in this appeal which has no merits and is dismissed in limine.
