This is a petition of wife for transfer of the divorce petition filed by respondent-husband at Rewari to Gurgaon on the ground of inconvenience claiming that the petitioner along with a minor child born out of the wedlock is staying at Gurgaon. The respondent has filed a divorce petition at Rewari.

Notice was issued to the respondent but despite service he opted not to appear and contest the petition, implying thereby, he does not have any objection to the transfer of the divorce petition.

Taking into consideration the fact that the petitioner is a lady staying at a distant place from the place of litigation, considering the inconvenience on account of the matrimonial litigation having been initiated by the respondent-husband at Rewari, in the interest of justice, the transfer application is allowed.

It is ordered that the divorce petition filed by the respondent

under title Yogesh Kumar Vs. Meena filed in the Court of Additional District Judge, Rewari be transferred from Rewari to Gurgaon.

Parties are directed to appear before the Court of Additional District Judge at Rewari on the next date of hearing. The Court of learned Additional District Judge, Rewari will inform the date of hearing for appearance before the Court at Gurgaon being 23.05.2015. The entire record will be transferred by office of District and Sessions Judge, Rewari to the office of District and Sessions Judge, Gurgaon. The District Judge, Gurgaon will entrust the case to the Court of competent jurisdiction for 23.05.2015. Parties may appear before the Court at Gurgaon on 23.05.2015 for further proceedings.

The above said order has been passed for appearance before Rewari Court in order to ensure that date of hearing at Gurgaon is intimated to the husband-respondent, who has opted to evade appearance before this Court despite notice.
