1. After arguments, these writ petitions are dismissed as not pressed with liberty to file fresh writ petitions provided that in the fresh writ

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petitions the petitioners who have taken VRS show that in accordance with the VRS scheme in which they took VRS, the petitioners are entitled to benefit of the pension etc now claimed. The fresh writ petitions must contain the VRS scheme and also make reference to the relevant clause showing as to how VRS employees such as the petitioners who had taken VRS can get pension etc.

2. Dismissed as withdrawn with the aforesaid liberty.
