ORDER

1. Pursuant to orders dated 15.07.2014 and 29.05.2014 passed in W.P.(C) 4282/2014 and W.P.(C) 3661/2014 respectively and order dated

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02.12.2014 passed by this Court in the above petitions and order dated 12.09.2014 passed in 6055/2014, respondents have filed compliance report whereby stated that the aforesaid orders have been complied with.
