2. The present writ petition has been filed for setting aside the judgment dated 05.05.2016 in Original Application No. 258 of 2015 passed by the Debts Recovery Tribunal against the petitioners.

3. At the very outset this Court takes note that the impugned

order has been passed by the Debts Recovery Tribunal (DRT), Patna against which the petitioners have adequate statutory remedy before the appellate authority.
