Writ application is required to be dismissed for two reasons, one that merely because the petitioner happens to be the son of a donor, he does not acquire any vested right under any law or rule which makes him entitled to delve into the affairs of working of the college in question. Sentiments have no role to play in the administration of public bodies.

The other ground is what has been stated by a Division Bench in Nagendra Sharma's case annexed as Annexure-A, dated 04.07.2011.

Writ is dismissed.
