It is the case of the petitioner that although the constituency in question was unreserved in the previous panchayat election but the petitioner is apprehensive that it is going to be reserved by fudging the population data on the category wise data.

In my opinion the fear of the petitioner is plainly apprehensive with no foundation and in such circumstances no mandamus can be issued.

The writ petition is disposed of accordingly.

The petitioner if so advised may pursue her remedy as available in law and if found sustainable, the authority concerned would dispose of the same in accordance with law.
