petitioners, and the learned Addl. Public Prosecutor, appearing on

behalf of the State.

This application for grant of anticipatory bail arises out
of Rajauli P.S.Case No. 188/2015, disclosing offences under
sections 341, 323, 308/34 of the Indian Penal Code.

The petitioners have no criminal antecedent. Learned
counsel for the petitioners submits that consequent upon an
altercation between the children of the two sides, the occurrence
took place. He submits that there is a counter case also lodged by
the petitioners' side relating to the same occurrence. He further
submits that taking into account the nature of accusation and the
status of the petitioners, there is no likelihood that they will flee

from the course of investigation or trial.

Considering the above, this application is allowed.

Let the petitioners, abovenamed, in the event of their arrest/ surrender before the court below within six weeks from today, be released on bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs.10,000/- (ten thousand) each with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the Chief Judicial Magistrate, Nawada in Rajauli P.S.Case No. 188/2015, subject to the conditions as laid down under section 438(2) of the Cr.P.C.

This is subject to the condition that the petitioners shall present themselves before the police/ court, as the case may be, as and when required and in the event of failure on their part to appear before the court on two consecutive occasions, their bail bonds shall be liable to be cancelled.
