Heard Mr. Bindeshwar Kumar, learned Counsel,

appearing on behalf of the petitioner, and Smt. Nivedita

Nirvikar, learned Additional Advocate General No.7, appearing

on behalf of the State-respondents.

Having regard to the fact that though the petitioner

has made allegations of defalcation/misappropriation of public fund, the petition is completely vague and does not, therefore, warrant invocation of extraordinary jurisdiction of the High Court, under Article 226 of the Constitution of India.

While, therefore, closing the writ petition, we give the petitioner liberty to lodge, if so advised, a First Information Report with jurisdictional police station, and/or file a complaint in the criminal court of competent jurisdiction in order to bring the guilty, if any, to book.

If the First Information Report is lodged or the complaint is filed, the same shall be dealt with expeditiously and in accordance with law.

With the above observation, this writ petition stands disposed of.
