Heard learned counsel for the parties.

The petitioner has claimed the following reliefs:-

- (i) To direct the 1st set of respondents for preventing the 2nd set of respondents from committing any criminal activity against the petitioner.
- (ii) To arrest the 2nd set of respondents who

have taken law in their hands; and

- (iii) To protect the life and liberty of the petitioner as well as his family members.

The petitioner is said to have purchased property vide sale deeds dated 11th June, 2013. It appears that there is a property dispute of the petitioner with the second set of respondents. Such dispute relating to property cannot be a ground for providing security to protect the life and property. The petitioner, if so advised, may seek the effective and alternative remedy from the Civil Court.

The writ petition is dismissed with the above observations.
