Learned counsel for the Zila Parishad, Gaya has
produced before this Court, a cheque issued in favour of Ashutosh
Kumar, the petitioner in compliance of this Court's order dated
09.10.2014 which has been handed over to Mr. Deepak Kumar,
learned counsel for the petitioner in the Court itself.

Considering the subsequent conduct of the opposite

parties, I am of the view that no case of deliberate disobedience of this Court is made out. Accordingly, this contempt proceeding is dropped and the petition is dismissed.
