2 09-08-2016 Heard the counsel for the petitioners and Mr Ambika Bhagat, Spl. P.P for the State.

The petitioners seek anticipatory bail in Amba P.S. Case No. 12 of 2016 registered under sections 448, 307 & 379 IPC including section 3(i) (x) of the SC/ST Act.

The allegation, in a nutshell, is that the accused persons came armed and assaulted the prosecution side. The injuries sustained by the injured are said to be simple in nature. There is a counter version of the case also. Although, the allegations are not serious, but section 18 of the SC/ST Act disables/bars the Court to

grant privilege of anticipatory bail.

Let the petitioners surrender in the court below and seek regular bail. If they do so, the same shall be considered and disposed of on its own merit in accordance with law unprejudiced by the present order.

The anticipatory bail application stands disposed of.
