A counter affidavit has been filed. Service of copy thereof on the counsel for the petitioners is not disputed.

The writ application is filed to question the legality of the notice (Annexure-3) issued by the Sub Divisional Magistrate under Section 18 of the Immoral Traffic Act, 1956. Mr. Kumar, on going through the averments made in the counter affidavit has pointed out that during the pendency of the application, the

respondent -Sub Divisional Magistrate has passed the order. Any order passed by the respondent- SDM can be challenged in appeal.
