The challenge in the present writ petition, said to be in public interest, is in respect of re-organization of the Regional Offices of the Central Bank of India.

The petitioner has invoked the jurisdiction of this Court without disclosing any cause to invoke the jurisdiction as he is not a customer of the Bank. The re-organization of the Regional Offices does not affect the rights of the account holders as it is for the proper

functioning, control and co-ordination of the Branches and does not affect the individual customer.

We find that the present petition lacks *bona fides* and is proxy litigation on behalf of some of the aggrieved officials of the Bank. The same is, thus, without any merit. Dismissed.
