3. 22-12-2016 Heard Sri Ajay Thakur, learned counsel assisted by
Smt. Babita Kumari, learned counsel for the petitioner and Sri
Umanath Mishra, learned Addl. Public Prosecutor.

The sole petitioner has approached this Court, with a
prayer to grant bail in the event of arrest or surrender in
Agamkuan P.S. Case No. 329 of 2016 registered for offence under
Sections 341, 326, 307, 34 of the Indian Penal Code and Section
27 of the Arms Act, 1959 and subsequently Section 302 of the
Indian Penal Code was added.

It was submitted by learned counsel for the petitioner
that F.I.R. was lodged against unknown, wherein, only fact was
disclosed that three accused persons on a motorcycle had arrived
and committed offence. He submits that during investigation, no



sufficient material has been collected to connect the petitioner, only on suspicion, the petitioner has been made accused.

However, learned Addl. Public Prosecutor, by way of referring to statement made in paragraph – 3 of the petition, submits that besides the present case, the petitioner is accused in other two cases also relating to serious offences.

Considering the fact that it was a case lodged against unknown for an offence under Section 302 & other allied sections of the Indian Penal Code and Section 27 of the Arms Act as well as the fact that some material has come to indicate the involvement of the petitioner and also the ground that petitioner is having criminal antecedent, there is no question for extending the privilege of anticipatory bail.

Dismissed.
