**ORAL ORDER**

2      11-05-2016      Heard learned counsel for the petitioners and learned counsel for the State.

In this case, the petitioners are seeking bail in connection with Laukahi P.S. Case No. 122 of 2015 registered for offences under sections 147, 148, 149, 454, 323, 341, 324, 307 & 504 of the Indian Penal Code and Section 27 of the Arms Act.

As per allegation, there is a direct allegation against the co-accused Surya Narayan Mandal against whom it is said that he caused fire arm injury on the victim but, has been shown innocent by the police in the charge-sheet whereas an allegation has been made against the petitioners to have caught hold the victim.

The petitioners had earlier moved before this Court in Cr. Misc. No. 48053 of 2015 and this Court vide order dated

2.11.2015, had given a direction to the petitioners to renew their prayer for bail after six months.

Looking to the facts and circumstances of the case, let the petitioners, namely, Raju Mandal and Baidya Nath Mandal @ Baijnath Mandal, be released on bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs. 10,000/- (ten thousand) each with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of learned Chief Judicial Magistrate, Madhubani in connection with Laukahi P.S. Case No. 122 of 2015, subject to the condition that (i) one of the bailors shall be a close relative of the petitioners (ii) if the petitioners are found involved in future in similar type of case, the prosecution will be at liberty to make prayer for cancellation of their bail and the court below will pass necessary order, including cancellation of bail and (iii) the petitioners would cooperate the proceeding of the court below. In event of failure to appear on two consecutive dates, the court below will be at liberty to pass the order, including cancellation of bail bonds
