Heard learned counsels for the petitioner and the State.

The petitioner being the husband of the complainant is apprehending arrest in a complaint case wherein process has been directed to be issued after cognizance being taken for the offences punishable under Sections 498A of the Indian Penal Code.

The basic accusation is of torture.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner admits his marriage with the complainant and is ready to keep the complainant as wife with full dignity and honour. A statement to that effect has been made in para 8 of the petition which reads as follows:-

“That the petitioner undertakes to keep O.P., No.2 as his wife with full dignity and honour.”

It appears that the complaint was filed in the year 2005

but the present anticipatory bail application has been filed in the year 2016.

Considering the present stand of the petitioner, let the above named petitioner be released on provisional anticipatory bail for two months in the event of arrest or surrender before the learned Court below within a period of twelve weeks from today, on furnishing bail bond of ₹10,000/- (ten thousand) with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of learned SDJM, Aurangabad in connection with Complaint Case No. 38 of 2005, subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

Let the learned court below issue notice to the complainant for her appearance. On her appearance, the petitioner will take the complainant to keep her as wife with full dignity and honour.

The provisional bail of the petitioner will be confirmed by learned court below in three eventualities (i) if the matrimonial harmony is substantially restored (ii) if the complainant fails to appear before the learned court below or (iii) if the complainant gets reluctant to reconcile the issue but provisional bail of the petitioner will not be confirmed if the matrimonial harmony is not restored due to laches on the part of the petitioner and in that event

the petitioner will surrender before the learned court below and
pray for regular bail.
