Writ is dismissed for the simple reason that the Court is not inclined to grant any kind of interest on delayed payment to any employee because the State has its limitation and commitment not only to a government servant or employees of the University but many other citizens, who also have a constitutional right under the framework of the Constitution. Enough of taking care has already been done by the State with regard to such employees and persons.

The greed also must have limits. It must be curtailed.

Writ is dismissed.
