Death of the so called 'employee', which was also a debatable issue, happened in the year 1989. Such an appointment is not a mechanism for backdoor employment of otherwise unemployed off-springs of a government servant. The object and purpose behind compassionate appointment

has been lost due to passage of time, almost three decades, now.

Writ application is dismissed.
